\$571,800 OTF Grant Gives Halton Youth a Voice in the Community

Burlington – In 2018, The Children's Aid Society of the Regional Municipality of Halton, the Secretariat for Our Kids Network received a \$571,800 Grow Grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, OTF to elevate youth voice and empower volunteers aged 12-17 to have a positive impact in the communities of North Oakville, Acton, Aldershot and Milton through the Halton Youth Initiative. The project will be completed in December of 2021 and will reach over 57,420 young people with a legacy that will be felt in Halton for years to come.
